

by and between Jackson R. Williams of Provincetown, in the county of Barnstable, State of Massachusetts, party of the first part, and The Provincetown Cold Storage Company, a corporation duly established by law and having its usual place of business in said Provincetown, and Henry McInnis of said Provincetown, parties of the second part.

WITNESSETH that whereas Letters Patent of the United States No. 885,412 for Improvements in Fish Traps were granted to the party of the first part on the twenty first day of April, 1908, and

Whereas the parties of the second part are desirous of obtaining the right to use said patented improvements;

NOW THEREFORE the parties have agreed as follows:

1. The party of the first part hereby licenses and empowers the parties of the second part to use in the harbor of Provincetown, Massachusetts, until the first day of January, 1918, two traps constructed according to the Letters Patent above mentioned and embodying the inventions described and claimed therein.

2. The parties of the second part agree to pay to the party of the first part thirty dollars upon each trap, as license fee, or sixty dollars in all for the two traps, said sum to be paid on the first day of April of each year until said first day of January, 1918.

3. In the event of said parties of the second part ceasing to use said invention above described and numbered 885,412 then in that event said parties of the second part shall not be liable to pay said license fee above mentioned.

The parties of the second part hereby acknowledge the validity of the Letters Patent above named.
