## December . . . 1902


The demand for hotel property seems to be on the increase. Messrs. Potter of the Pilgrim House, Smith of the Atlantic House, and J. C. Rockwell are all said to have recently made offers for the Central House.

## June 18, 1903

The New Central House opened for public patronage June 15th with an efficient corps of help. Its inviting aspect received many favorable comments. It is universally conceded to be in every detail a first class hotel.
