In the early 1900's William K. "Billy Nick" Nickerson operated this "accommodation" up and down Commercial Street at a pace slightly faster than today's summer auto traffic. The house in the background was Dr. Campbell's office and residence, long since torn down, according to Mrs. Charles Rogers of 167 Commercial Street. In its place stands the former Cutler's Pharmacy building just west of the Mayflower Cafe at 300 Commercial
