## <u>- May 12, 1966</u> -Methodist Pastor To Be Transferred

In an announcement made from the pulpit last Sunday morning. Rev. Gilman L. Lane, pastor of the Provincetown Methodist Church for the past 10 years, confirmed the fact that he will be transferred to another parish, with final action to be taken during the district conference in New London, Conn., on June 19. The change has been agreed upon by Bishop James Mathews, and by District Superintendent G. Homer Ginns of Middleboro, who first made the announcement of the impending change at the church's annual meeting last week. Rev. Lane emphasized that the change was being made at his own request. As ministers who are transferred usually serve one more Sunday in their old parish, it would seem more than likely that Rev. Lane's final Sunday morning service as pastor will be June 26. His replacement will probably not be known until the ministerial changes are announced at the conference.

Rev. Lane came here to replace Rev. Arthur O. Dewey, and in his tenure as minister has seen the old church on Commercial Street sold to Walter Chrysler for the Chrysler Art Museum, and the erection of a new building on Shank Painter Road. Last year the church also sold the old parsonage on Center Street, and constructed a new one adjacent to the church.

Rev. Lane has served with the fire department and its rescue squad, and as present chairman of the Cemetery Commission. Mrs. Lane has served as a teacher and principal of the Veterans Memorial School, and their daughter, Judith, after graduating last year from Provincetown High School, is now attending the Deaconess School of Nursing.
