In Provincetown in 1839 was born
Nehemiah Mayo Dyer, who entered
the navy as a volunteer in 1862. He
was many times promoted, took part
in the battle of Manila Bay, May 1,
1898, and was given the rank of
rear admiral, 1901. He died in
1910.

Rev. James Freeman, born 1759,
minister of King's Chapel for fifty-
four years and father of what is
known as the Unitarian movement in
America, was the son of Constant
and Lois Freeman, both natives of
Truro. He was the leader in the
theological change which altered the
liturgy and doctrine of King's Chapel
from that of the Church of England
to the form it has ever since retain-
ed. He wrote a series of important
papers concerning the history of the
towns of Barnstable county, which
were published in the collections of
the Massachusetts Historical Society.
A marble bust and mural tablet to
his memory were placed in King's
Chapel.
