

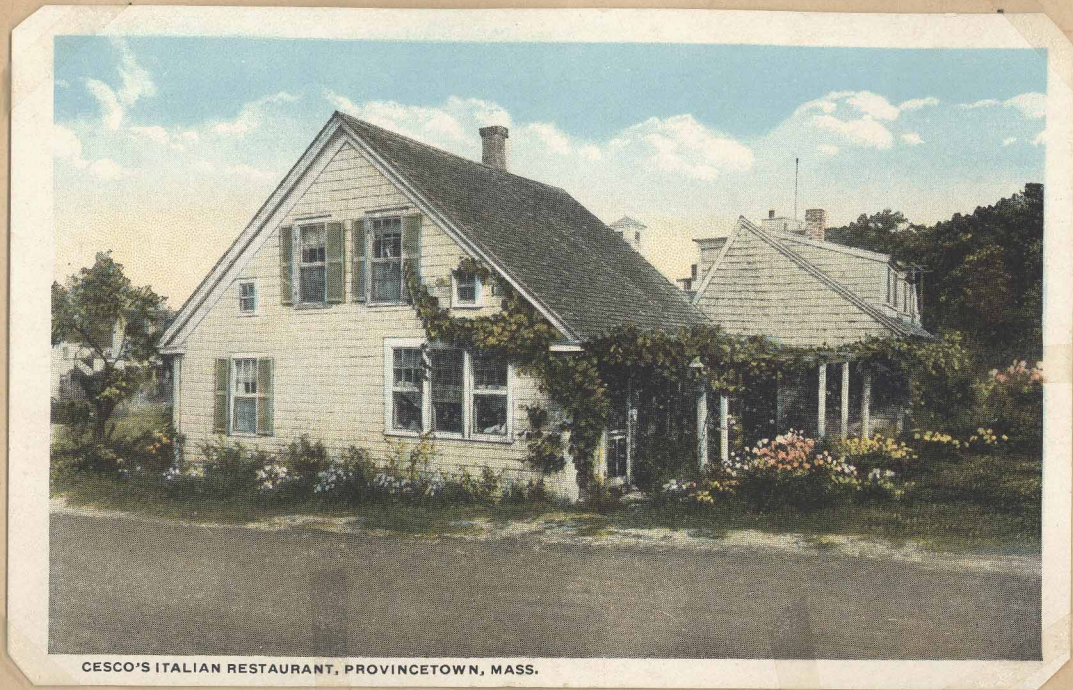
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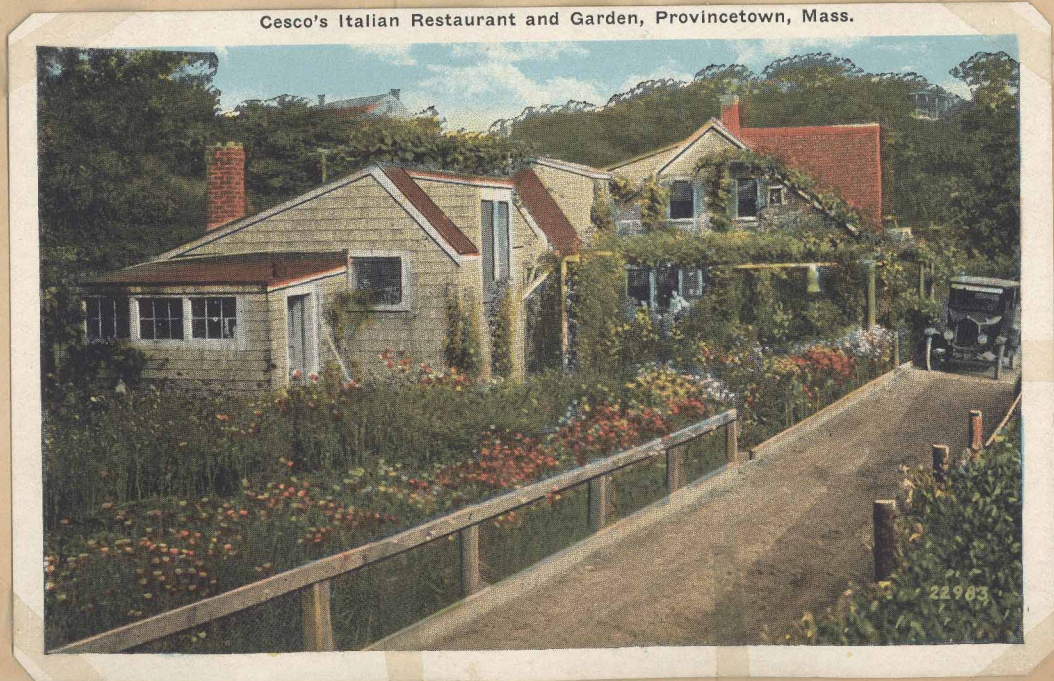
**THURSDAY, JUNE 9, 1949**
