Another ice invasion occurred at this harbor Tuesday night and, although the wind was from southwest and blowing quite strongly yesterday forenoon, the pressure of ice outside harbor was sufficient to push the ice inside the harbor west, against the wind and fill all waters except a portion west of railroad wharf. Some of the cakes which grounded at the east end of harbor exceeded in height any that entered harbor earlier in the winter. By-the-way, one cake that was aground on Long Point end Monday measured twenty feet in length.
