## Crew Safe After Fishing Boat Wrecked

**Shaken Up**

The two oldest crew members, Mr. Balaud and Mr. Summers, who said they were somewhat shaken up by the experience and wanted to get home as quickly as possible, were given first-aid and hot coffee at the Race Point Coast Guard Station and were then flown to Boston by helicopter. Appearing on a TV newsreel Tuesday night, Mr. Summers said he has been going to sea for 40 years and that he intends to go back to sea again.


It was a most unlucky day for the Margaret Rose whose misfortune included the burning of her pilot house about noon of the same day. Coast Guardsmen and those crew members who were still at the scene boarded the vessel and battled the blaze, bringing the fire under control and avoiding the impending threat of ignition of the thousand gallons of fuel oil reported to be aboard. It was thought the fire might have started from a short circuit in the engine room.

Later in the day the crew

returned to their homes by taxi-cab.


It was reported that the Coast Guard secured the crippled fishing vessel with an anchor to protect against drifting with the rising tide. It was also reported that the owner had employed men to keep a fire watch from the beach; and that the owner had engaged a commercial salvage company to investigate and make recommendations.

Although more than eight years have passed since the last breeches buoy rescue in waters off the Nar-
