31 Watson's Court is a 1-1/2-story, 3-bay dwelling; ell-shaped; fenestration is 1/1 vinyl DHS throughout; primary entrance is accessed by a pane-and-panel aluminum door with wood surround; partial returns and corner boards; interior brick ridge chimney; gable dormer on north roof slope with 8/8 wood DHS; stucco-covered chimney on north slope near east facade; 1-story ell section in rear.
