3 Winslow Street is a 1-1/2-story, 5-bay dwelling; fenestration includes 6/6 wood DHS with wood surrounds throughout, gable dormers with 6/6 wood DHS, windows on north gable end are paired 6-pane wood casements; center entry with plastic covering door; replacement square flat hood over door - resembles a large block of wood; entry is accessed by brick steps and metal handrail; interior brick ridge chimney; shed wall dormer on rear cross-gable section; secondary entrance in north gable end has wood panel door with wood surround containing fluted pilasters.
