2-story, approximately 3-bay; asphalt roof shingles; shed dormer on west slope and east slope; primary entrance on an angle at corner of Standish and Freeman containing a pane and panel modern aluminum door accessed by wood steps; fenestration includes 1/1 vinyl DHS, basement windows on east facade boarded; 2-story, flat roof section on front facade; basement entrance on front facade accessed by brick steps down to entrance, with wood shingle pent eave; 1st, 2nd, and 3rd story decks on rear with exterior access
