Describe architectural features. Evaluate the characteristics of this building in terms of other buildings in the community.

143-143A Bradford Street is a 1-story, 11-bay, Astylistic structure; the side gable roof is clad in asphalt shingles, The exterior brick chimney is located on the east side.; the exterior is clad in vinyl and the foundation is concrete block; the fenestration includes replacement windows throughout, a shallow bay window is located in the bay nearest to Bradford Street on the primary façade; the primary entrances on the west façade consist of a modern pane and panel aluminum door with a modern storm, a centered, poured concrete and brick porch deck with an iron railing and a modern pane and panel aluminum door with a modern storm accessed by concrete block and brick steps; A 1-story shed-roofed addition is located on the side façade; A flat-roof, 2-story section rises from the south side.
