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### ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION

411 Commercial St. is a 2-1/2-story, 2-3-bay, vernacular Queen Anne-style dwelling; cross-gable roof is sheathed in asphalt shingles, exposed rafter ends, interior brick chimney, large gable dormer centered on front roof slope; exterior is clad in vinyl siding with wood shingles on 3rd story of canted bay; building sits on a concrete block foundation; fenestration includes modern Chicago-style windows on 2nd-floor of front façade, 2/1 wood DHS on side facades; centered primary entrance is accessed by a wood pane-and-panel door, sheltered by a 1-story hipped-roof portico supported by thin posts; 3-story canted bay on side façade; 2nd-story deck supported by oversized knee braces on same façade; 1-story shed located on rear facade has a 2nd-story roof-top deck.
