410 Commercial St. is a 2-story, 2-bay, Queen Anne-style dwelling with side/rear addition; hipped roof is sheathed in asphalt shingles, central brick chimney; exterior is clad in wood shingles with wood trim and wide wood frieze; building sits on a brick foundation; fenestration includes 4/4 and 8/8 DHS windows with storm windows; primary entrance is sheltered by a 1-story hipped-roof porch with spindlework frieze and lattice trim; porch has side steps to driveway; 2-story bay on front façade and a bay window on the 1st story of the side façade; flared wall connection between 1st and 2nd stories.
