1 1/2-story, 5-bay, side gable roof with asphalt shingles; partial returns, pilasters and frieze board; pane and panel vinyl door with modern storm, large wood surround with hipped roof; entry porch supported by turned posts and frieze spindlework and simple balustrade; wood porch deck accessed by wood step; 1/1 vinyl DHS; connected to a 2-story, 3-bay modern building on north with a front gable roof, poured concrete foundation, wood shingle exterior, 1/1 vinyl DHS windows, hipped-roof full-facade porch with square posts and balustrade and exterior stair to 2nd floor entrance.
