

ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION

Describe architectural feaures. Evaluate the characteristics of this building in terms of other buildings in the community.

196 Bradford Street is a 1 1/2-story, 3-bay dwelling. The roof is side gable and a brick chimney is located on the rear roof slope. The exterior is clad in wood shingles with wood trim. The foundation is rusticated concrete block. The 1-story, full façade incised open porch features a half-wall and the roof is supported by battered columns. The porch has arched openings. The front roof slope has a shallow shed-roofed dormer with 12/1 DHS windows with snap-in muntins. Windows elsewhere in the dwelling are paired and single 1/1 DHS and single-light casements. There is a diamond-shaped, multi-pane window on the west façade. A rear ell has been added, including a garage and secondary pedestrian entry on the west façade and 2 entries on the east façade.
