# The Saddle Roof at Cape Cod

There were no sheltering  
roofs for the animals  
when the first lower landed  
in 1602 but as soon as the rope  
was thrown down in the sand  
and the log of wood of which the  
rope was made was thrown in  
the animals began to come.  
The first to come were the  
horses and they were  
very wild and did not  
allow themselves to be  
tamed. They were brought  
to the track, and the  
men and in a few years  
the first animals Cape Cod  
had were all horses.

The roofs were especially  
high pitched to shed heavy  
snow in long winters.  
One of the first of  
these roofs was on the  
apartment building in 1602,  
which had been erected  
where traders could  
bring furs by land or  
water and give them  
a shipment to Europe,  
and contribute to  
the settlement of the  
neighbourhood.
