Dear Mr. Lawrence:

I have your letter of April 11th, inquiring about the City of Gloucester's policy in appropriating funds for the Blessing of the Fleet, which has been held here every summer for many years.

It appears that we think along the same lines in setting up funds for this purpose, as Gloucester actually considers this event a summer attraction, just as your "Old Home Day" would be.

The St. Peter's Fiesta Committee sponsors the Blessing of the Fleet. The City contributes towards the expenses of the St. Peter's Fiesta. The City Auditor pays bills presented to him by this Committee up to \$600.00.

This money is actually set up under our Celebrations & Entertainment Account, as are expenses for Summer Band Concerts, Carillon Concerts, Festival of the Arts, etc.

Frankly, the City Council and I feel that all the citizens benefit from this expenditure in that it brings many visitors to our City, whose second largest industry of course is Summer tourists.

Vocal Here April 11, 1960 City Manager Gloucester, Massachusetts Dear Sir: It is my understanding that your city for some years has participated in the celebration of the Blessing of the Pleet, and I am writing at the suggestion of the Selectmen of Provincetown to inquire if you ex-

pend city funds in connection with this religious ceremony.

Some opposition to the use of Town funds for this purpose has been registered for the reason that it is a religious ceremony.

Would you please advise as to how you handle the matter. Do you use city funds? If so, how much do you use and for what purposes?

The Selectmen of Provincetown plan to have an Article at a special Town Meeting to appropriate a sum of money for the celebration of "Old Home Day", as provided by law, and have the Blessing of the Fleet as part of the program. I took the matter up with the Director of Accounts, Herman Dine, at the State House and he advised that it would probably be all right to spend money for the occasion if done as part of Old Home Day or Week. He suggested contacting Gloucester officials on how you handle it.
