

WHO'S WHO

Phoebe Otis (Tracy) began performing on Cape Cod in 1963 with the Orleans Arena Thertre, where she did everything from working in the box office to playing the lead in Ladies' Night in a Turkish Bath. Her credits include Leave It to Jane, Write Me a Murder, A Christmas Carol, Beyond the Revolt of Mamie Stover, The Mound Builders, Trial By Jury, and Pirates of Penzance. Phoebe also writes and performs a cabaret act and received the Golden Gull Award for Best Female Performer of 1979. Tracy is her second role with PTC, following Lucy in Dracula (1989).


Kevin Todd (Ben) most recently appeared with the PTC as Tim in Noises Off (1989). Since moving to town two years ago he has also performed in Provincetown Theatreworks productions of Isn't It Romantic and Execution of Justice. Kevin is a former principal dancer with Philadelphia Civic Ballet Company and has performed with the Mt. Laurel Regional Ballet Company, Rita Jones Dance Company, Pennsylvania Ballet, and American Ballet Theater (on tour).

Michael Prevulsky (director) is the Artistic Director of the Provincetown Theatre Company. His recent credits here include an original production of Dracula, the world premiere of Norman Allen's Larry Queen of Scots, last year's award-winning Noises Off and The Real Thing. He will be directing the PTC/Harwich Theater Company co-production of Noises Off opening in Harwich in March, and Sweeney Todd here at the PTC in June.

Don Nigro (author) has written more than twenty plays, produced in theaters all over the United States. He has received playwriting grants and fellowships from the National Endowment for the Arts and the Ohio Arts Council, among others. **Seascape with Sharks and Dancer** was first produced in May 1974 in the Theater Barn at the University of Massachusetts in Amherst. Subsequently mounted at the Denver Center Theatre and Touchstone Theatre, the Oregon Shakespearean Festival, and Indiana State University, the play owes its first Cape Cod production to PTC.

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Cape-Tip Company In Fine Form For Sharks & Dancer

There was a time some years back when the Provincetown Theatre Company could be counted on to present shows that were just a bit more polished, just a bit more professional, than those put on by other community theater groups in the area. It probably will never again dominate the local scene the way it used to, but with shows like Don Nigro's Seascape With Sharks & Dancer, its current production, the company takes yet another step towards restoring its reputation for excellence.
