The PTC Playwriting Competition

Provincetown has long been known for its support of burgeoning artists and writers. The platform it has provided for new playwrights is particularly noteworthy. It is a tradition that predates Eugene O'Neill, extends through Tennessee Williams, and continues today.

In keeping with this heritage the Provincetown Theater Company has adopted as part of its mission the development and support of new works by local writers. Since its inception in 1963, PTC has brought over 15 original scripts to the stage. These include works by noted writer and illustrator Edward Gorey, as well as original works by Cape writers Norman Allen, Sinan Unel, David Matias, Susan Seligson, Carol Verburg, Michael Prevulsky, and Ron Weissenberger.

The most recent development in PTC's attempt to foster new work is the PTC Playwriting Competition. First instituted in 1996, the Competition is open to all Cape playwrights, culminating in a cash award of \$500 and a directed reading in Provincetown. Any previously unpublished full-length play is eligible.

Through the PTC Playwriting Competition, the Provincetown Theater Company hopes to increase awareness of local works while providing meaningful encouragement and support to emerging writers.

PTC is proud to present the 1997 PTC Playwriting Competition winner: David by Mr. Tom O'Leary. The 1996 winner was Harwich playwright Iain Anderson for his two-act play entitled Three Day Leave.

THE CAST

Mark Baker (Adam O'Brien) is known to local audiences as an actor and past president of the PTC Board of Directors. Trained in theatre at Pomona College outside Los Angeles and the American Conservatory Theatre in San Francisco, Mark has been in many PTC productions, several Edward Gorey productions, local playwright Sinan Unel's *The Three of Cups* for which Mark won the A.C.T.E. Award for Best Actor, and most recently in Tom O'Leary's *The Negative Room* and *The Guest House Diaries*. A year-round resident of Provincetown for over seven years, Mark lives with his partner, sculptor Tom McCanna, and his two Jack Russell terriers, Cosmos and Puck.

Jesus Cortez (Miguel). "I've been performing basically all my life! But seriously, I've done all the things that you could do at an early age: glee club, drama club, choir, dance contests, etc....Recently, in P'town, I had the fortunate opportunity to be part of the drag troupe, *Where the Boyz R* (formerly known as *Boyz R Us*). I've been doing drag for the last four years, performing around town. And just a month ago, I had the greatest time on a taping of "Sally," which will air this month (November)."

Casey Clark (Waiter). Casey was last seen as the drooling administrative assistant in W.H.A.T.'s production of 7 Blowjobs. Other Cape performances include PTC's Cute Boys in Their Underpants

Fight the Evil Trolls and W.H.A.T.'s production of All in the Timing. Casey enjoys returning to Cape Cod after pounding the pavement in New York City.

John Dowd (John). A painter living in Provincetown since the early '80s, John has periodically been encouraged (roped into) nonsensical theatrics with Ryan Landry's Mandalay Opera House and the Provincetown Writers Theatre Group. Sign: Aquarius.

Oscar Guevara (Another Man) is new in P'town from Miami. He has acted with the Central Venezuela University Children's Theater, including roles in urban updates of *Cinderella*, *Peter Pan*, and *Pinocchio*. He is excited to be working with PTC and early awaits more demanding roles.

Richard Hawkins (Franklin O'Brien) was last seen as Mike Caruso, the cross-dressing cop, in *Bed and Breakfast* at the U.U. Meeting House Theatre this summer.
